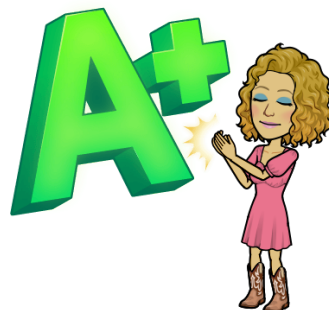

Cell Phone Policy

Food/Drink and Restroom Passes

Students may not bring food or drinks to class. This course is taught in a science lab classroom, and eating in a lab setting is a safety hazard for students. Bathroom passes are hanging in the front corner of the classroom. You may take it and go to the restroom. Ask to use the restroom; then quietly sign out, take the pass and go. It is expected that you will go only to the restroom and then straight back to class. Per MHS policy, students who take advantage of restroom privileges will be spoken to individually and parents will be contacted. If abuse is habitual, a student may lose bathroom privileges altogether.
